

**Hello ACCPAC Plus user:**

HARD TO BELIEVE - Today is the [15 year anniversary](#) of ACCPAC Plus (for DOS) being officially discontinued in 2006.

If you are still using ACCPAC Plus, we thought today would be a good day to remind you that Adagio accounting is the best upgrade path for ACCPAC Plus (DOS) users. Adagio is a modular, flexible, easy to use windows-based accounting program. Adagio is functionally compatible with ACCPAC Plus albeit with many, many improvements. Adagio will easily and quickly convert your ACCPAC Plus data resulting in a fast, low-pain migration. Adagio has screen layouts, reports and business logic that are similar to ACCPAC Plus resulting in a very simple learning curve and minimal re-training.

No development has been done on ACCPAC Plus since the late 1990's! Microsoft Windows operating systems have not allowed the running of DOS programs like ACCPAC Plus for many years. Microsoft ended support for Windows XP, the last version of Windows that natively supported DOS programs in April, 2014. If you continue to run ACCPAC Plus, you are risking being unable to access all of your business accounting information.

**Imagine if, all of a sudden, you could no longer and never again access ACCPAC Plus!**

The latest version of Adagio Ledger now has built-in simple project cost tracking. You can set up projects and then when you enter a Ledger entry, Payables invoice or Receivables invoice you can specify the project and then get reports of all revenue and expense for a project. An example might be an art dealer that wants to keep track of all costs for a particular painting and then be able to see their profit or loss for that painting.

Other things that you can do in Adagio that you can't in ACCPAC Plus are:

- Export most grid screens to Excel for analysis and sharing using Adagio's ExcelDirect function
- Have 2 fiscal years open at once (with a soft year-end) so you don't have to immediately close a year in the first few days of January and can start posting transactions for the new year in the General Ledger.
- Maintain multiple years of history in Ledger (Unlimited history, 10 years of financial reporting)
- Drill down to account, fiscal period and transaction level from the financial statements.
- Copy/move batches and optionally updating the fiscal period, date, description, reference, etc.
- Recover deleted/posted batches
- Optionally allow Unpost/reverse of posted batches
- Reprint posting journals at any time during the year

- .. and much, much more

Adagio has/now has:

- Longer account, vendor and customer name, address, contact name and comment fields.
- 2 description lines for most master file records and transactions
- Support for Windows printers
- Adagio Payables Integration with 1099 Express to easily file 1099 forms electronically
